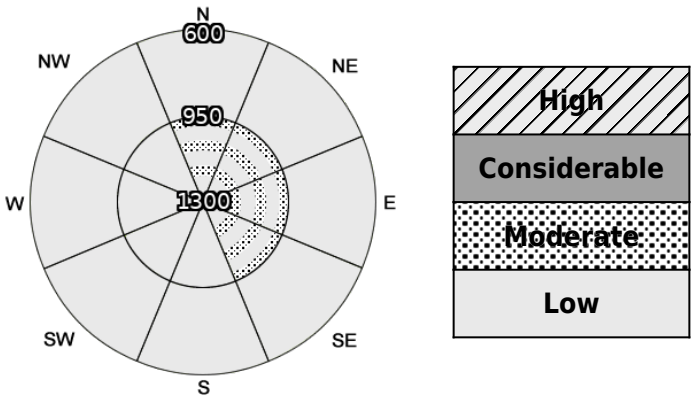
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The old snowpack which is mostly confined to East to South aspects above 900 metres will become firmer in the cooler temperatures. Localised accumulations of moderately bonded windslab will begin to develop on North through East to South-East aspects above 950 metres. Corrie rims and gully tops will be mostly affected. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Some precipitation is expected overnight. This will fall as snow above 800 metres on strong South-West to North-West winds. Through the day it will be mainly dry, winds will become light and eventually veer to the East. The freezing level will fall to 700 metres.
