

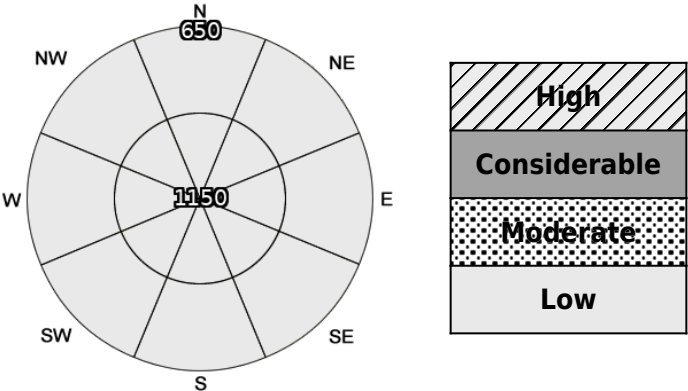

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The existing patchy snowpack will freeze and further consolidate in the colder conditions. Some very shallow deposits of windslab will be deposited at the top of North-East to South-East aspects above 800 metres. However, these areas will be isolated and generally avoidable. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

After some overnight snow showers a generally dry day is expected. Moderate winds will be from the West. The freezing level will be around 400 metres.
