

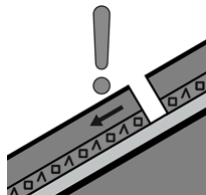

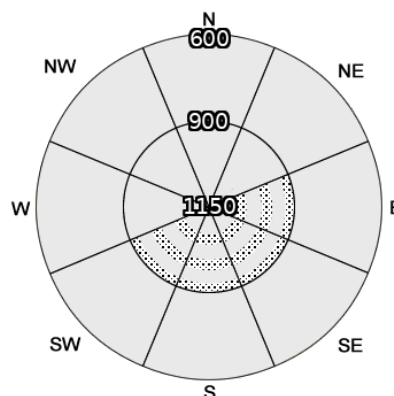
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The dry, cold deposits will continue to drift in the strong winds. Generally the snow cover will be thin with good stability. In isolated steeper, sheltered locations where deeper windslab overlies hard snow-ice, deposits will only be moderately bonded. Steep burn lines, gully exits and corrie rims on East through South to South-West aspects from 900 metres are most likely to be affected. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

No precipitation has been forecast and the variable cloud cover will eventually clear to give a sunny afternoon. It will remain cold with the freezing level at around 400 metres. Winds will be strong North-North-Westerly throughout the period.

Significant temperature gradient in the snow at today's profile site with poor stability demonstrated.
