

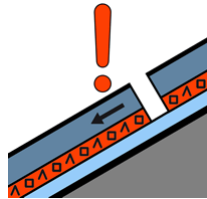

Avalanche Problems



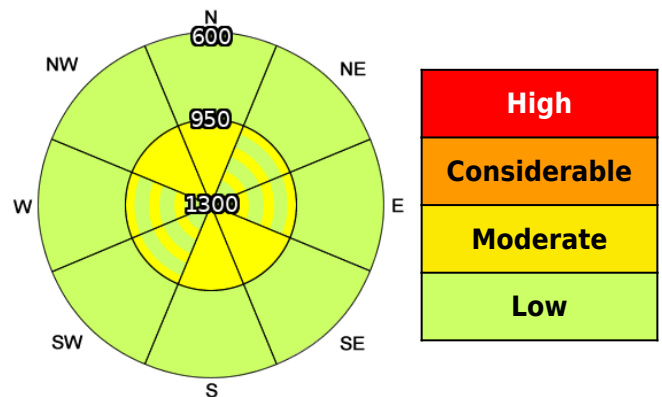
Wind Slab



Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Localised areas of unstable windslab will persist in isolated wind sheltered steep places on mainly South-East to Southerly aspects above 1000 metres. During the day drifting snow will quickly build additional localised unstable windslab onto mostly West to Northerly aspects above 950 metres with gully exits and coire rims most affected. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Light Westerly winds overnight will back and strengthen to strong South-Easterly then Easterly from midday. Freezing level around 400 metres. Light snowfall from glen levels during the afternoon, amounts uncertain.

Comments

Unconsolidated snow on all aspects, changing winds will redistribute lying snow and quickly build windslab onto North-West to North aspects.
