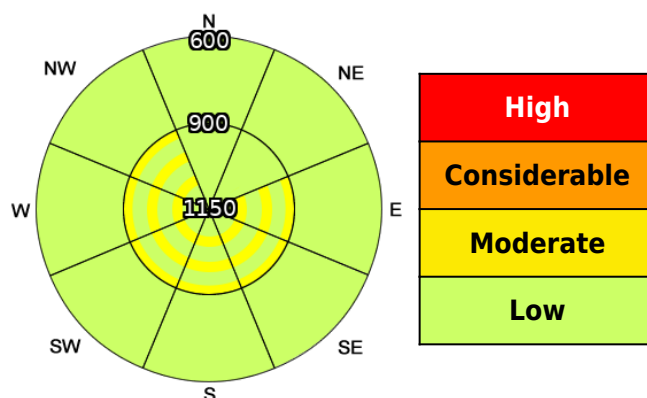


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE MODERATE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Friday 29/12/2017****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Persistent Weak Layers****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

There will be a general thin covering of snow above 600 metres, which despite the changing winds will remain stable. Existing windslab will be present in wind sheltered locations on some East to South-East aspects above 900 metres with new weaker accumulations developing on South through West to North-West aspects. Gully exits, corrie rims and sheltered scarp slopes will be most affected. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Remaining cold with snow showers during the day at all levels. Winds will mainly veer throughout the period, from the North-West overnight to strengthen and become East-South-East by morning then Easterly by afternoon.

New snowfall during the afternoon, expected to be light but some uncertainty over amounts.
