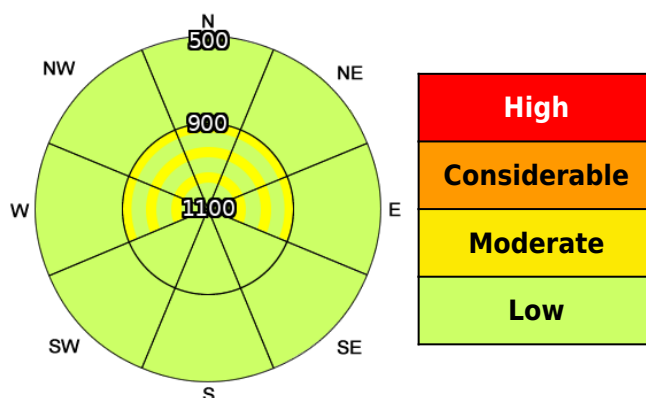
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Some new localised windslab accumulation is possible as cold unconsolidated snow, lying above 900m is re-distributed onto steep gully heads on West through North to North Easterly aspects; some cross-loading may also occur onto very steep East facing gully flanks. Exposed hillsides will become scoured, the old snow patches will remain hard and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Remaining mostly dry and cold. A bright day is expected with the freezing level around 300m, there is the possibility of some light snow later in period. Light West North West winds overnight will freshen South-Easterly from first light, becoming more Easterly as the day progresses.
