

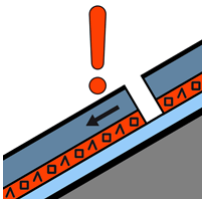

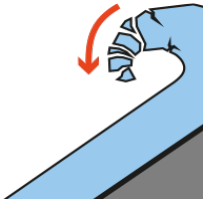

Wind Slab



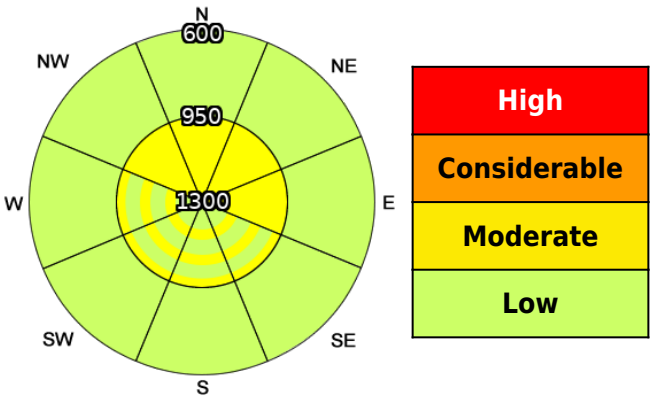
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Isolated areas of unstable windslab will persist within steep sheltered areas on mainly South-East to Southerly aspects above 1000 metres. Unstable windslab will continue to develop on mainly North-West through North to East aspects above 950 metres with Coire rims and gully exists being especially affected. Fragile cornices will develop on these aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Dry overnight with moderate South-Easterly winds easing. During the day some snowfall is expected with light Southerly winds increasing to strong and veering to the South-South-West. The freezing level will rise from 350 to 600 metres.

Comments

Hard going underfoot conditions. Deep drifts in boulder fields and hollows, ice glazed boulders.
