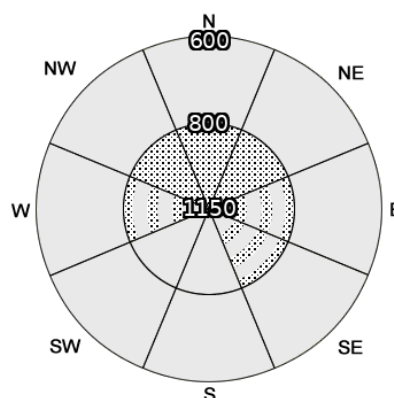


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE MODERATE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Tuesday 02/01/2018****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Persistent Weak Layers****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Fresh accumulations of unstable windslab will rapidly form due to the period of precipitation and strong winds. Moderately bonded snow will be present on West through North to South-East aspects from 800 metres. In some steeper, sheltered locations such as gully exits and around corrie rims, moderately to poorly bonded windslab will be present. Wind lips and small cornices will start to form. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Dry overnight with winds becoming strong North-Westerly. There will be a period of moderate snowfall from late morning until mid-afternoon. Precipitation will be accompanied by fresh increasing to strong generally Southerly winds. Freezing level will fluctuate around 600 metres.

Comments

Difficult mountain conditions will develop with the arrival of snow on strong winds.
