

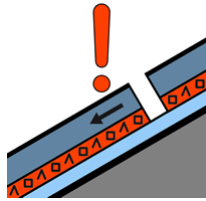

### Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Wednesday 03/01/2018

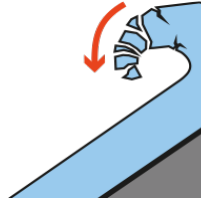
#### Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab



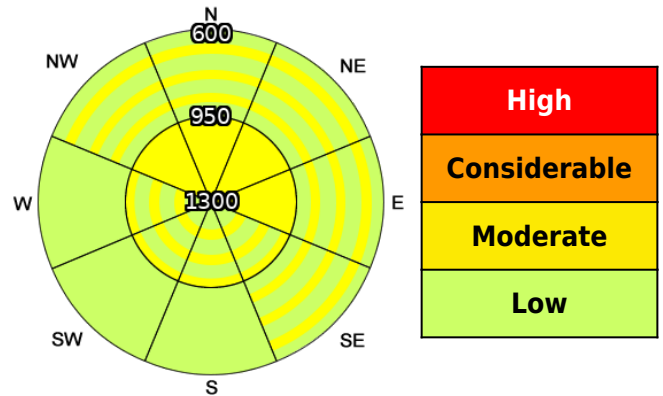
Persistent Weak Layers

#### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Some consolidation will take place of the recent snow deposits above 600 metres which will be moderately stable in only the steepest places. Poor to moderately well bonded wind slab will persist on some steep and isolated wind sheltered places on North-West through North to Easterly aspects above 950 metres. Locations such as coire rims, gully exits, ridge flanks and crag aprons will be most affected. Developed cornices will be unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



#### Forecast Weather Influences

Winds will lessen overnight and will be light to moderate strength South-West to Westerly during the day. Some snowfall overnight and a dry day is expected, although there is some uncertainty about snow amounts. Freezing level will be around 700 - 800 metres.

#### Comments

Remaining cold and wintry with some uncertainty about snow amounts thursday.
