

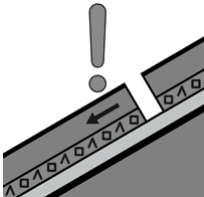

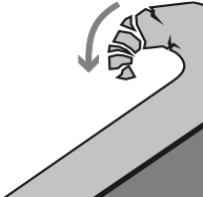

Wind Slab



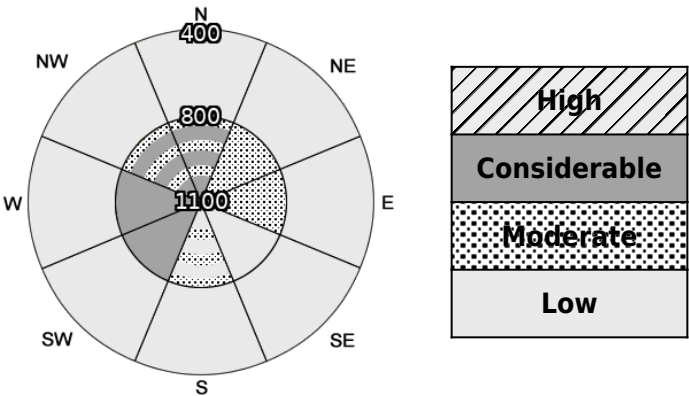
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New areas of poorly stabilised windslab will build and become more widespread on steep, mainly South-West to West aspects above 800 metres and in steep, lee gully flanks. All new cornice development around coire rims will be weak. Scouring on high exposed hillsides and ridges. Better stability on most aspects below 800 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Further snow showers overnight will be accompanied by strong. Mainly North-Easterly winds, these will die away as the winds ease moderate slightly during the day. It will be a cold day with a Freezing Level of 700 metres lowering to 200 as the day progresses.
