

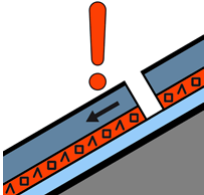

Avalanche Problems



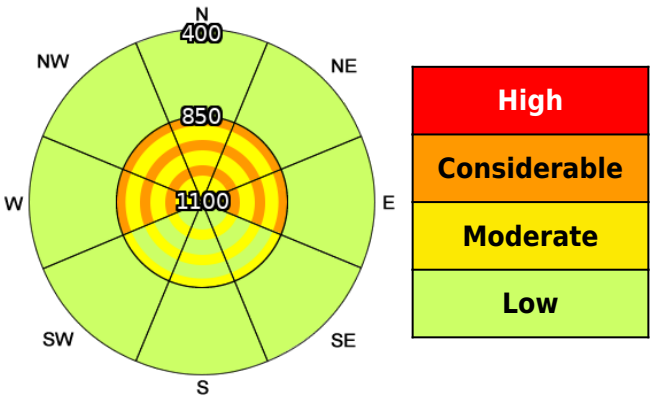
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Areas of new poorly stabilised windslab will exist on steep, mainly North-West through North to North-Easterly aspects above 850 metres. Some loose snow instability with small single point release events are also possible on sun affected, Southerly aspects below 900 metres, particularly around midday. Good stability on other wind scoured hillsides and ridges. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

High pressure will continue to build and maintain the dry, cold conditions. The fresh East-North-East winds will ease East-South-East, becoming light, and then increasing fresh South-Westerly, then South by the end of the period. The Freezing level will lower from 800 metres to all levels overnight, then back briefly to 800m for a period around midday.
