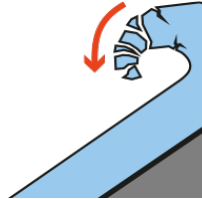

Wind Slab



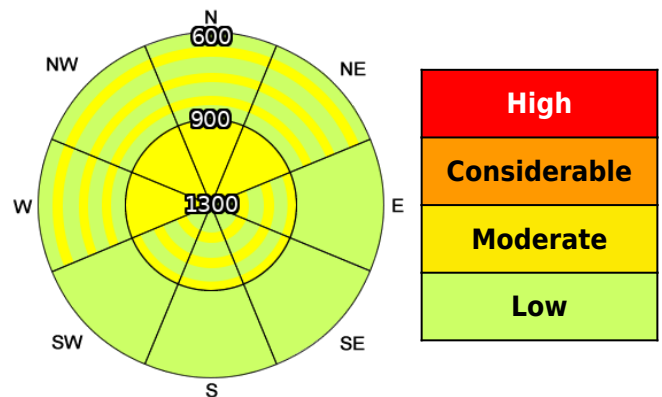
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New unstable windslab will develop on Westerly through North to North-East aspects mainly above 900 metres. Areas most affected will be coire rims, gully tops flanks and crag aprons. Fragile cornices will also build in these areas. Below this altitude more localised windslab will develop on steep terrain features and sheltered hollows. Some instabilities will remain at depth in these places especially where the snowpack becomes more shallow. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

It will remain dry and very cold over the next 24 hours with sunshine during the day. Moderate South-South-Westerly winds will back to the South-South-East and increase to strong.
