

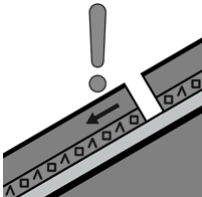

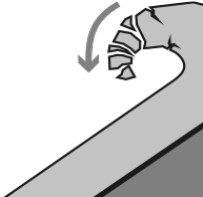

Wind Slab



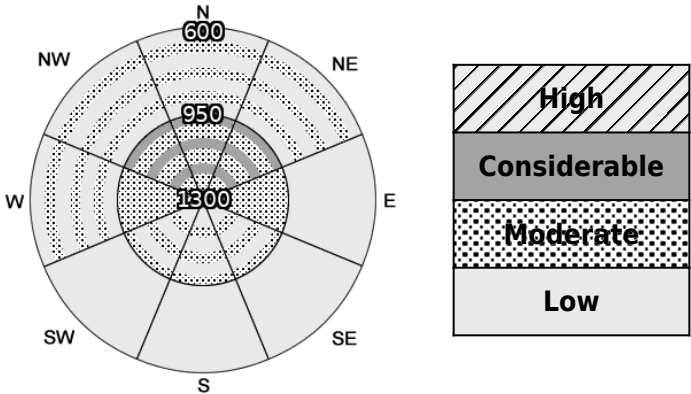

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Drifting will continue with unstable windslab becoming more extensive on North-West to North-East aspects mainly above 950 metres. Areas particularly affected will be steep convex terrain, around coire rims, gully tops, scarp slopes, crag aprons and steep hollows. More localised windslab will form on other slopes due to cross loading. Cornices will be fragile and prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Severe strength South-Easterly winds will ease a little during the afternoon. It is expected to be mainly dry with potentially some light snow or freezing drizzle. There will be a temperature inversion above 900 metres with freezing levels expected to rise above the summits.
