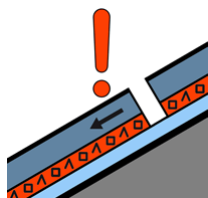
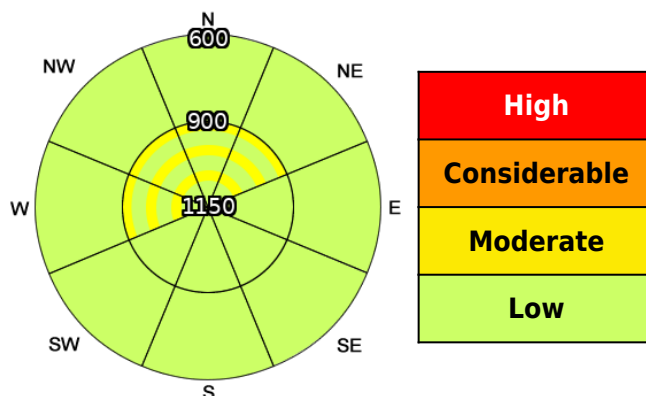


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE MODERATE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Wednesday 10/01/2018****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Persistent Weak Layers****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

A brief fluctuation in the freezing level will continue to improve overall stability at all levels. The snowpack will be firm and well bonded in most locations but new soft unstable deposits will develop mainly on West through North to North-East aspects above 900 metres. Any new accumulations are expected to be light. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Overnight, the freezing level will rise to above the summits before dropping back to around 900 metres by dawn. There will be some light patchy rain and snow overnight, continuing throughout the morning. Winds initially strong from the South-East will ease, becoming light from the North-North-East in the afternoon.
