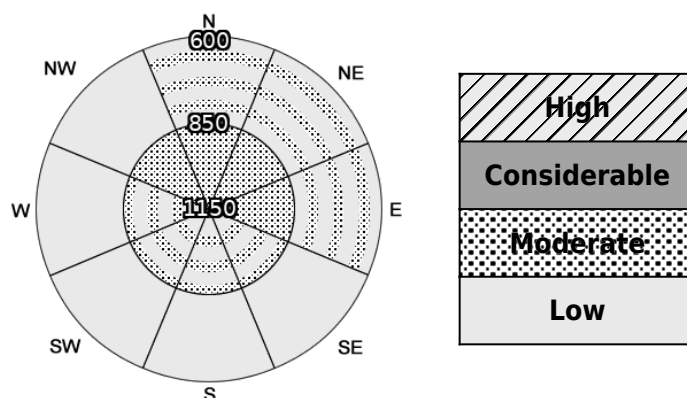
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Little change is expected to the snowpack, stability will remain variable with localised pockets of moderately bonded windslab in wind sheltered locations primarily on West through North to East aspects above 850 metres. These areas are not particularly extensive, with the tops of slopes and gullies being most affected. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

High pressure building maintaining dry conditions with light winds, these will be fluctuating but mainly from an Easterly direction. The freezing level will be around 700 metres falling to 500 metres by the end of the period.

Comments

The high pressure will drift away to the East on Thursday night allowing a strengthening southerly wind to develop with gales over the summits .
