
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Localised windslab will continue to develop on Northerly aspects above 950 metres mainly around coire rims, gully tops and crag aprons. More isolated on other aspects due to cross loading. Some instabilities will persist at depth on Northerly aspects above 1000 metres but these will be protected by the strong upper layers, steep convex terrain and high in corrie back walls will be most affected. Elsewhere stability will be generally good. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

It is expected to be dry with strong South-South-Easterly winds continuing. The freezing level will be around 600 metres.

Comments

Cool tomorrow, turning wet and windy on Sunday, with snow on highest tops, then cooler again at the beginning of next week.
