

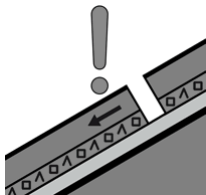

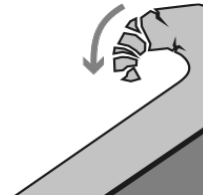
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab



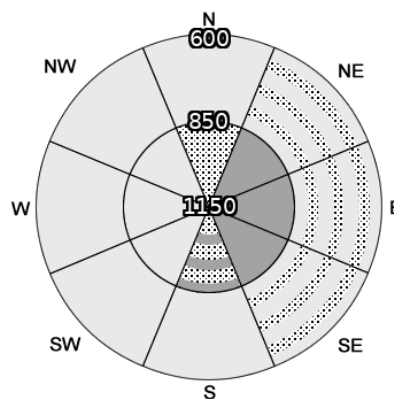
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

There will be some further development of unstable windslab which will be found in sheltered features such as corrie rims, scarp slopes and gully exits mainly on North-East through East to South-East aspects above 850 metres. North and South aspects will also be affected by cross-loading. Elsewhere, cornices will continue to develop. Any areas exposed to the winds will be firm and icy. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

It will remain cold at all levels with some light snowfall, mostly overnight. Winds will be strong, mainly from the West-South-West to South-West direction.
