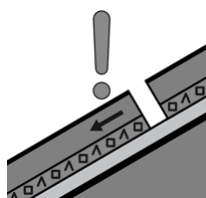


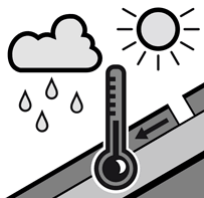

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 22/01/2018

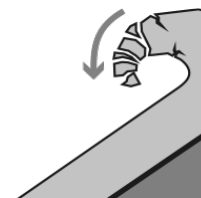

Persistent Weak Layers



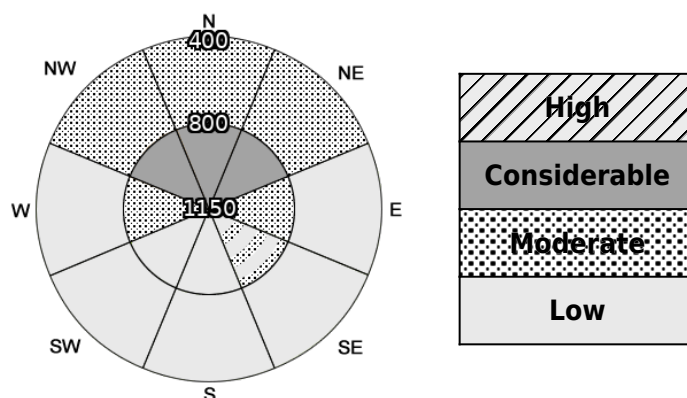

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The existing snowpack will consolidate slightly through the day. However, unstable areas of windslab will remain in sheltered locations at higher levels. Most affected will be North-West to North-East aspects above 800 metres. Unstable cornices will also exist. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

There will be some light precipitation which will fall as snow above about 800 metres. The freezing level will be around 1000 metres. Moderate to strong winds will be from the West-South-West.
