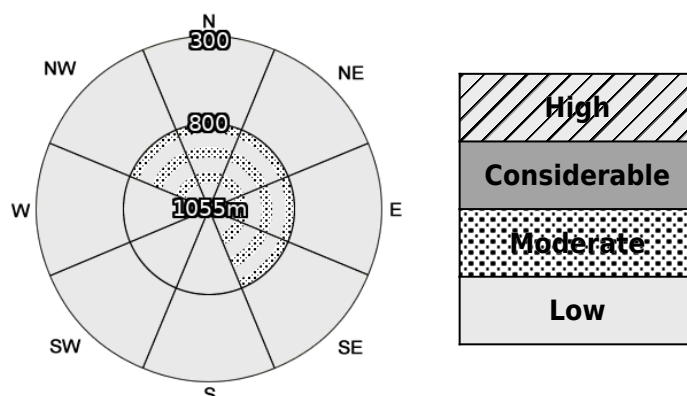
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Areas of new wind slab will accumulate on North-West through East to South-East aspects above 800 metres on steep wind sheltered areas. Remaining areas of deeper snow on South to West aspects will be generally stable with wind exposed ridges and ribs clear of any significant snow. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Strong West-South-West winds will back South-South- East later this evening, veer South-Westerly. Winds will gradually ease by the late afternoon turning West-South-West. Scattered snow showers are expected. The freezing level will be around 650 meters rising to around 1000 metres in the early morning for several hours then returning to around 650 metres.

Comments

An active front moving through our area with gale force winds and scatted showers. Moderate amounts of snow forecast at higher levels.
