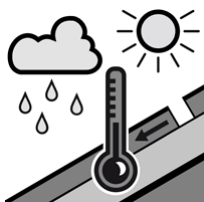
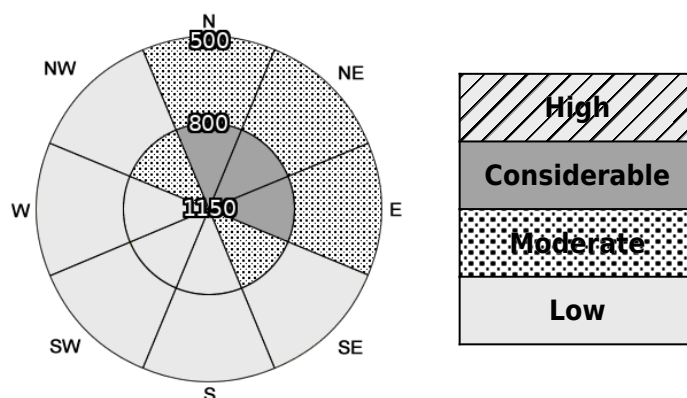


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE CONSIDERABLE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Wednesday 24/01/2018****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Wet Snow****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

After a brief period of instability in the early hours of the morning the existing snowpack will consolidate in the cooler conditions. However, fresh areas of unstable windslab will be deposited on sheltered North to East aspects above 800 metres. These are expected to become more extensive during the day. Windward aspects will be scoured and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

A complicated and stormy forecast. For most of the period the freezing level will be around 800 metres, with showers falling as snow above 700 metres. However, for a brief time during the early hours of the morning the freezing level will rise above the summits and heavy rain will fall at all levels. Very strong winds will be from the South-West.
