

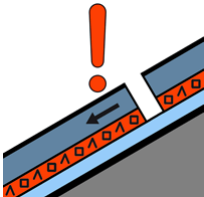

Wind Slab



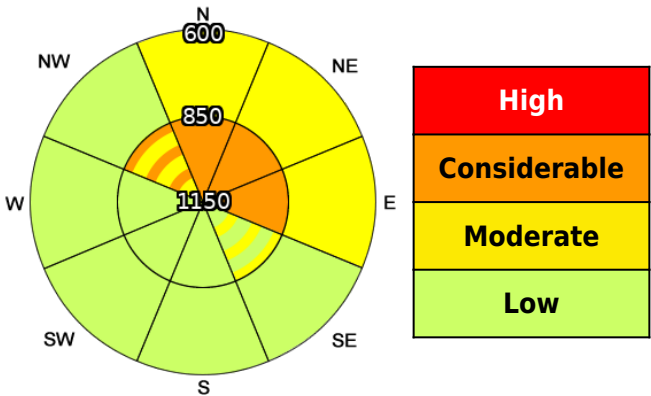

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Fresh unstable windslab will continue to develop in sheltered areas, mainly on North-West through North to East aspects above 800 metres. Most affected areas will be the tops of steep wind sheltered gullies and coire rims above 850 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight, the freezing level will lower to 600 metres with snow showers falling to 500 metres, during the day drier conditions can be expected. The very strong South-Westerly wind will decrease throughout the period becoming moderate and variable in direction.

Comments

Outlook; dry with lighter winds on Friday, and freezing at all levels. Strengthening Southerlies on Saturday with snow gradually turning to rain at all levels. Winds then veering Westerly increasing to gale or severe gale and freezing levels falling back to 900 metres.
