



Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 25/01/2018


Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab




Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Moderately bonded windslab will continue to develop in steep, sheltered locations mainly on North to East aspects above 800 metres with isolated areas also to be found on North-West and South-East aspects due to cross-loading. Gully exits and corrie rims will be particularly affected. Elsewhere, any new cornices will be unstable. Terrain exposed to the winds will be scoured. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Continuing cold with snow showers above 600 metres throughout the night until mid-morning. Winds will initially stay strong from the South-West but will ease throughout the day becoming light from the North-North-East.
