
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will be generally well bonded and stable in most areas with a surface crust. Isolated mostly thin accumulations of windslab will be found on North through East to Southerly aspects mainly above 1000 metres. Areas most affected will be in steep locations such as gully tops and coire rims and where it achieves depth it will be moderately well bonded. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Light snow showers overnight on light to moderate Northerly winds. Through the day it will be dry, with winds easing through the morning before backing to the South-South-West and increasing to moderate through the afternoon. The freezing level will fall from 700 to around 500 metres.
