

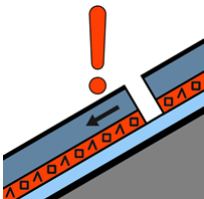

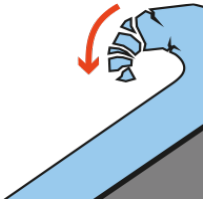
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab



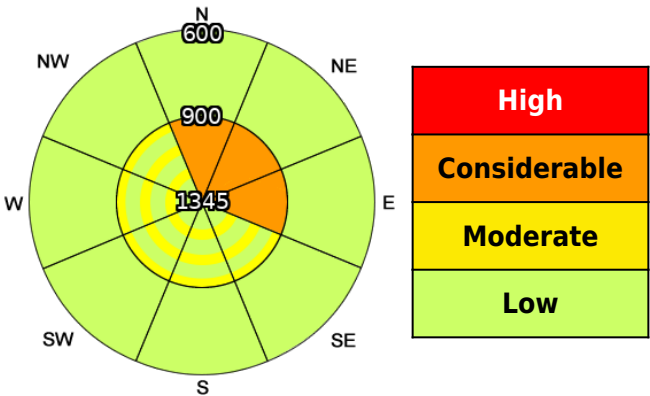
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Areas of unstable windslab will be present, with greatest accumulations on steep North to East aspects above 900 metres. Localised areas of unstable windslab will also be present on North-West and South-East aspects. During the period there may be some re-distribution of snow forming localised deposits of unstable windslab on other aspects. Recently formed cornices will remain fragile. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

It is expected to be dry with the freezing level generally around 600 metres. Winds are expected to be moderate North-North-Easterly overnight, easing in the morning, and then increasing and veering moderate South-South-Easterly from midday.
