

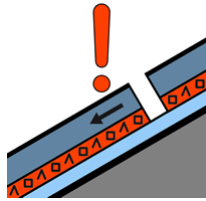

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Saturday 27/01/2018

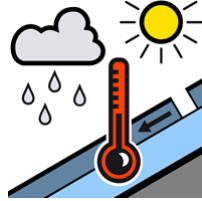
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab



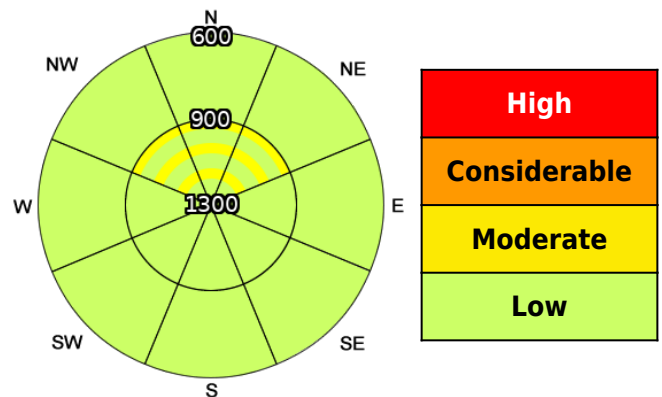
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

As the temperatures rises instabilities will develop on North-West to North-East aspects above 900 metres. Areas most affected will be confined to steep locations such as coire rims, gully tops and convexities. Some wet snow instabilities on steep banks below this altitude. During the afternoon the snowpack will begin to consolidate and shallow generally avoidable windslab will develop on Easterly facing slopes. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Light snowfall overnight, turning to rain at all levels by mid morning as the freezing level rises to above the tops. Cooler through the afternoon with light snowfall mainly above 800 metres. Moderate Southerly winds will increase to strong and veer to the West during the day.

Comments

A brief mild spell tomorrow before turning cooler again.
