

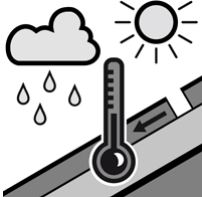

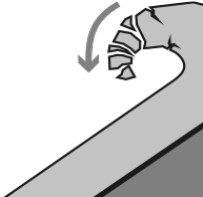

Wind Slab



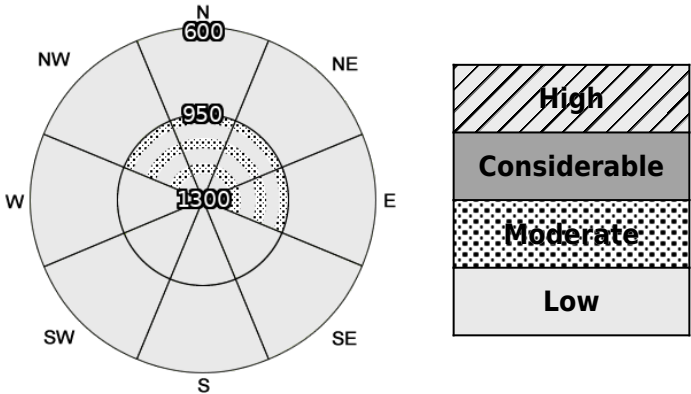

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Initially the old snowpack will continue to consolidate in the cooler overnight temperatures. Isolated accumulations of windslab will develop on North-East to South-East facing slopes above 950 meters. As the freezing level rises wet snow instabilities will develop mainly on North-West through North to Easterly aspects above 950 metres. Areas most affected will be within steep and convex terrain. Rock and falling ice will be a hazard. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Strong to Gale force Westerly winds will gradually ease to moderate through the day. Cooler temperatures overnight with light snow showers above 800 metres. This will turn to drizzle at day break as the freezing level rises to well above the tops.

Comments

Rock and icefall and cornice collapse a potential hazard.
