

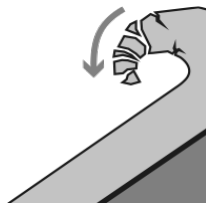

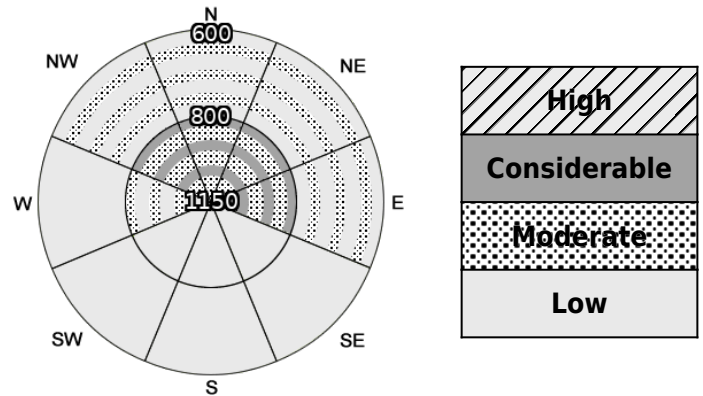

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

There will be a cycle of thaw freeze thaw as lower overnight temperatures consolidate the moist snowpack above 800 metres. Mild conditions during the day will lead again to the snowpack thawing at all levels. Localised wet snow instabilities will exist on steeper slopes and cornices will be unstable. Areas mostly affected will be North-West through North to East aspects above 800 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight, the freezing will rise from around 900 metres to well above the summits. At first a period of light snow this followed by rain at all levels for the rest of the day. The winds will be gale force Westerlies overnight easing through the day becoming West-South-West.

Comments

A North-Westerly airflow will replace this mild weather on Monday bringing more snow down to 300-500 metres.
