There will be some further development of unstable windslab, mainly on North-East to South-East aspects above 800 metres. Localised areas of windslab will also be found on North and South aspects. Sheltered terrain such as Corrie rims, gully exits and convex features will be most affected. Elsewhere, unstable cornices will continue to develop. Any areas exposed to the winds will be firm and icy. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

There will be snowfall throughout this period above 500 metres. Severe gale force winds will be from the North-West overnight veering slightly to the North-North-West during the day.
