

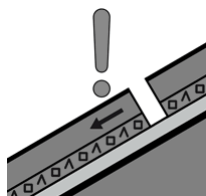

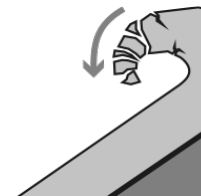

Wind Slab



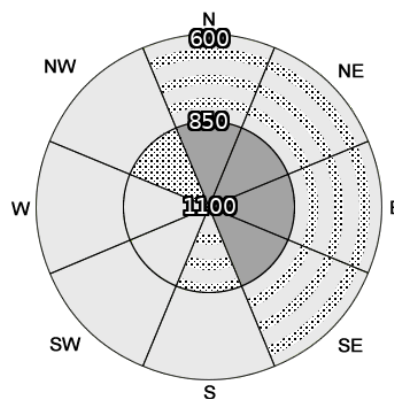

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Further accumulations of windslab will develop along with some re-distribution of existing deposits on East to South- East aspects above 850 metres. In steep, sheltered gully flanks of other mainly North to North-Easterly aspects some deep accumulations of poorly stabilised windblow snow will also exist. New cornice development in all locations will be fragile and prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Showers will continue throughout the forecast period with strong North-Westerly winds bringing further snowfall to above 400 metres. The freezing level will remain around 500-600 metres throughout.
