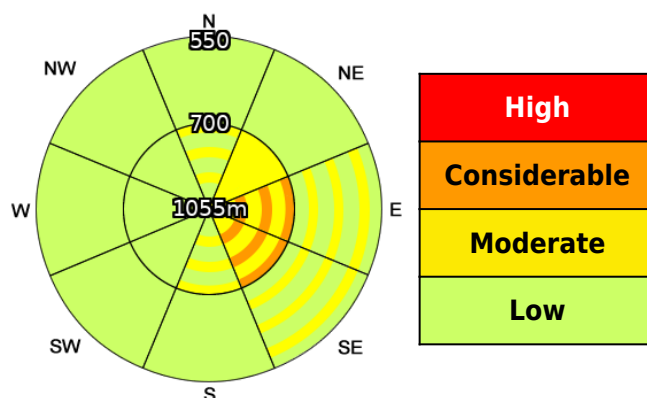


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE CONSIDERABLE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Saturday 03/02/2018****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Persistent Weak Layers****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Further amounts of snow and windslab will accumulate on North through East to South aspects, mainly above 700 metres, adding to the existing localised moderate to poorly bonded snowpack. Most affected will be steep slopes in wind sheltered locations, particularly crag aprons, gullies and ridge flanks. Cornices will continue to grow above steep slopes with similar aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

A band of snow is expected overnight and persisting through the day with snow lying mainly above 500 metres. The generally Southerly winds will freshen by daybreak, veering North-North-West by the afternoon, with stronger gusts. The freezing level will settle around 600 metres.
