

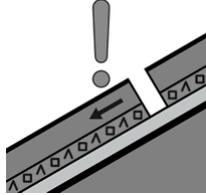

Avalanche Problems




Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The vast majority of recent deposits will be moderately well bonded. Isolated pockets of moderately to poorly bonded windslab may be encountered in steeper, wind sheltered locations on East through South to South-West aspects above 1000 metres. During the afternoon light drifting will start to accumulate fresh windslab on the same aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

After a dry night there will be some light snowfall during the day. Winds will be light Westerly during the morning increasing to moderate North-North-Westerly by the end of the period. Freezing level will be at 600 metres throughout.

Comments

Rate of drifting will increase as the wind speed picks up in the afternoon.
