

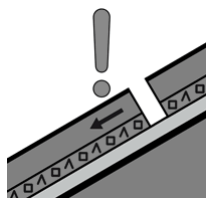

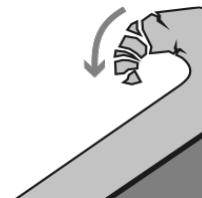

Wind Slab



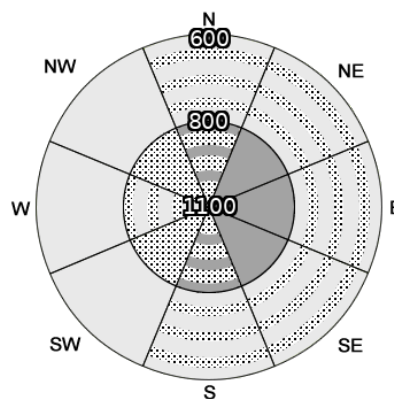
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Fresh unstable soft windslab will be deposited in sheltered areas, mainly on North through East to South aspects. Areas of older windslab of varying stability (both moderate and poorly bonded) and consistency will also be present on many aspects above 800 metres. Greatest accumulations will be on North-East to South-East aspects but other aspects, especially North and South, will also be affected. Cornices will be fragile and prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Initially dry this evening, precipitation is expected to start from midnight falling as snow above 500 metres for the rest of the forecast period. Winds will be light generally Southerly overnight; moderate Westerly later North-Westerly during the day. The freezing level will be around 600 metres.
