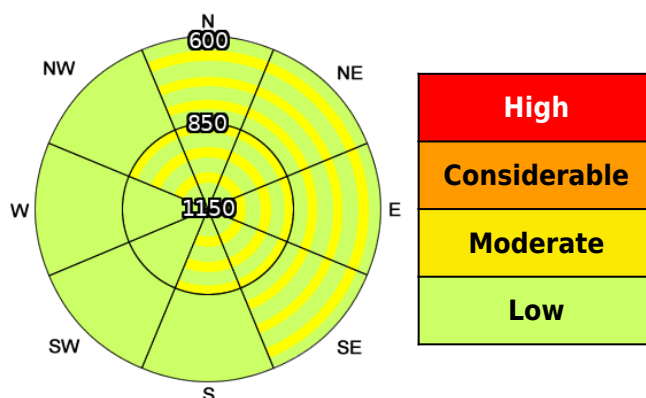


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE MODERATE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 05/02/2018****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Persistent Weak Layers****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Localised areas of moderately well bonded snow will be found on many aspects from North-West through North-East to South-East, with deepest accumulations being found in steeper, wind sheltered locations on North-East to South-East aspects above 850 metres. As the wind speed increases during the day some redistributed deposits may form shallow windslab on North-West to North-East aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

It will be a cold and mainly dry day but a little patchy snowfall is possible. Light South-South-Easterly winds overnight will increase to become fresh Southerly during the day. The overnight freezing level will lower from 650 metres to reach 400 metres during daylight hours.

Comments

Some ridges are corniced. Caution required as fracture line can be further back from the edge than you might think.
