
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Localised accumulations of moderate to poorly bonded windslab will continue to develop on mainly North-East to South-East aspects above 900 metres. Although these accumulations are not expected to be extensive, most affected areas will be lee aspects or wind sheltered coire rims, ridge flanks and gully exits. Elsewhere the snow-pack will be generally stable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Some light snow overnight then a dry day is expected. Freezing levels will be at 200 metres throughout with summit temps of minus 8 deg celsius. Winds will be moderate to fresh in strength, South-Westerly veering North-Westerly by the afternoon.
