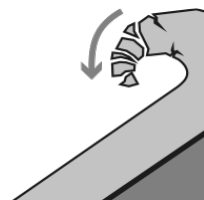
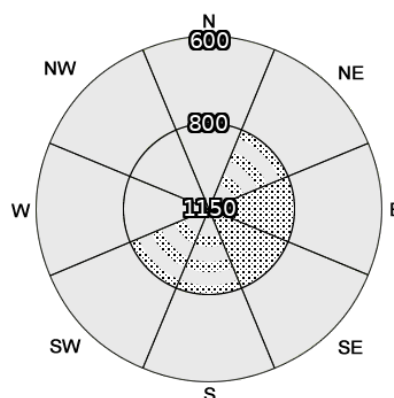


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE MODERATE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Tuesday 06/02/2018****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Cornices****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Snowfall and redistribution of existing deposits will lead to unstable windslab developing mostly in steep wind sheltered locations on North-East through East to South-West aspects above 800 metres. Older localised instabilities will also persist on steep terrain on these aspects. Gully exits, corrie rims and scarp slopes will be most affected. New cornices will also start to redevelop. Elsewhere, the snowpack will be generally be well bonded and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

There will be light snowfall at all levels overnight. Winds will be fresh in strength from the South-South-West before strengthening and veering to the North-North-West then settling from the North-West for most of the day.
