





**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Unstable windslab will persist on sheltered North to East facing slopes above 700 metres, particularly gullies and corrie rims. Some consolidation of this slab will take place at lower levels. Fragile cornices will exist above these aspects and be prone to collapse. Good stability on wind scoured slopes and ridges. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



**Forecast Weather Influences**

Southerly winds veering West-South-Westerly backing South-Westerly by early morning and moderating. Persistent snow dying out with occasional showers tomorrow falling as snow above 400 metres. The freezing level will briefly rise above the summits this evening as the warm front moves through then dropping to around 500 metres overnight.

**Comments**

Wind increasing in strength from early morning with constant snow and heavy drifting above 650 metres.
