

Wind Slab





Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New unstable windslab will be deposited on sheltered areas throughout the forecast period. Greatest accumulations will be on North through East to South-East aspects above 800 metres where avalanches are likely. North-West and South aspects will also be affected during the period. Cornices will be fragile and prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Persistent snowfall above 300 metres is expected overnight; more showery during the day falling as snow at most levels. Overnight the freezing level will lower from 500 to 200 metres. Winds will be moderate to strong, initially Southerly, veering West-North-Westerly overnight and West-South-Westerly for much of the day.
