



Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Saturday 10/02/2018



Wind Slab




Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Drifting snow with unstable windslab developing on North-West through North to Easterly aspects above 950 metres. Areas most affected will be in steep sheltered areas particularly coire rims, gully exits and convexities. Lee areas on other aspects will be affected by more localised instabilities due to cross loading. Fragile cornices will develop. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Snow showers from the middle of the night onwards, these will turn much lighter though the day. Moderate South-West winds will back to the South, increase to strong, then gradually ease and veer to the South-West through the afternoon. The freezing level will rise to 700 metres.

Comments

A little milder towards the end of the day before turning cold again, heaviest snowfall expected during Saturday evening.
