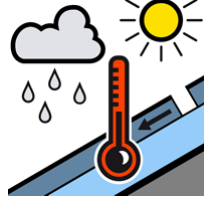

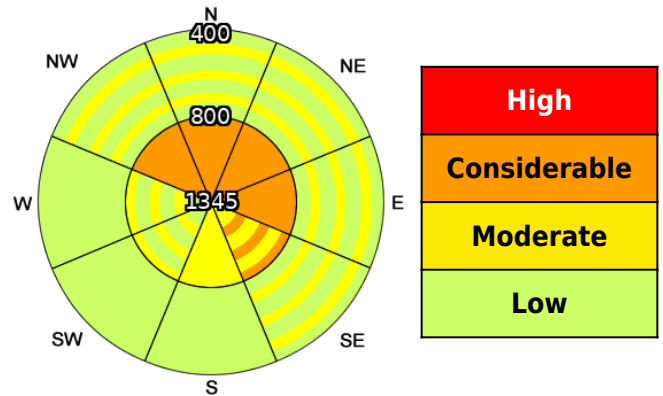

**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Continuing drifting and snowfall will deposit further accumulations of unstable windslab in sheltered areas. Greatest accumulations will be on North-West through North to East aspects above 800 metres where avalanches are likely. South-East aspects will also be affected. Cornices will be fragile and prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



**Forecast Weather Influences**

A period of snowfall is expected after midnight, becoming more showery from mid-morning. Winds will increase to strong Southerly overnight; easing to moderate South-Westerly mid-morning. The freezing level will rise to around 900 metres in the morning, then falling to 500 metres.

**Comments**

A windy and snowy period with milder conditions expected during the early morning.
