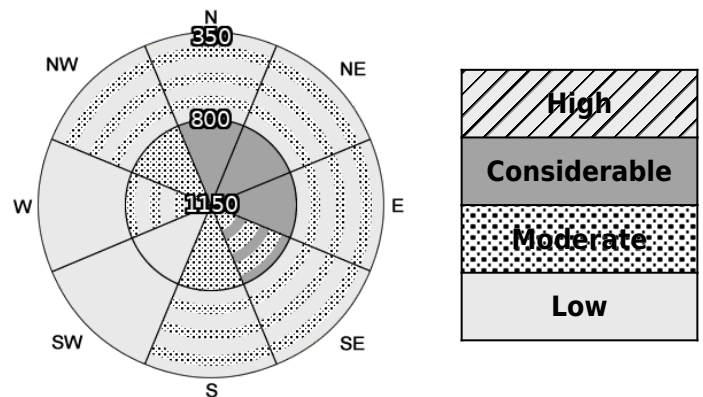
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable, weakly bonded windslab will continue to develop mainly on North-East to South-East aspects above 800 metres where avalanches are likely. Instabilities will also be present on steep sheltered Northerly slopes. Some other aspects will have more localised pockets of instability due to cross loading. Cornices will be soft and unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Frequent snow showers overnight, continuing through the day, falling to lower levels. The freezing level will rise from sea level to around 200 metres. The strong West-North-Westerly winds will ease slightly before backing to the South and strengthening.

Comments

More snow is forecast for the next two days and staying generally windy.
