

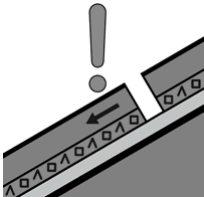

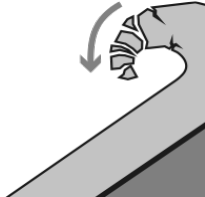

Wind Slab



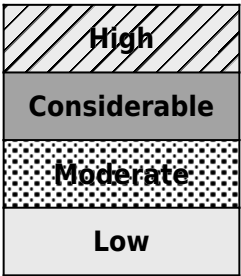
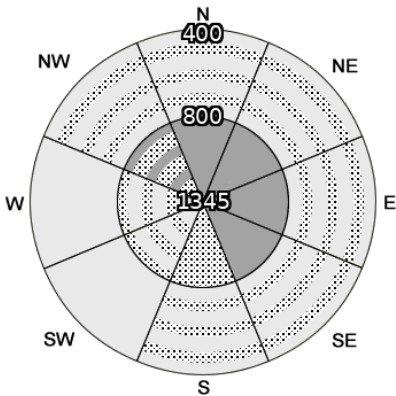

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Further snowfall, and the wind redistribution of the existing snowpack, will deposit further layers of unstable windslab on top of the significant deposit that already exist. Most affected will be North through East to South-Easterly aspects above 800 metres where avalanches are likely. Other aspects may be affected by cross loading. Cornices will be unstable and prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Snow showers will continue throughout the period. Moderate Westerly winds will back to the South-West, and then to the South in the late afternoon. It will remain cold with a freezing level of around 300 metres.

Comments

Lots of soft windslab about, particularly at the tops of slopes and gullies. Take care!
