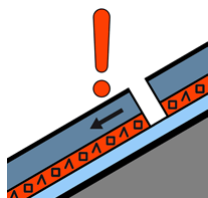
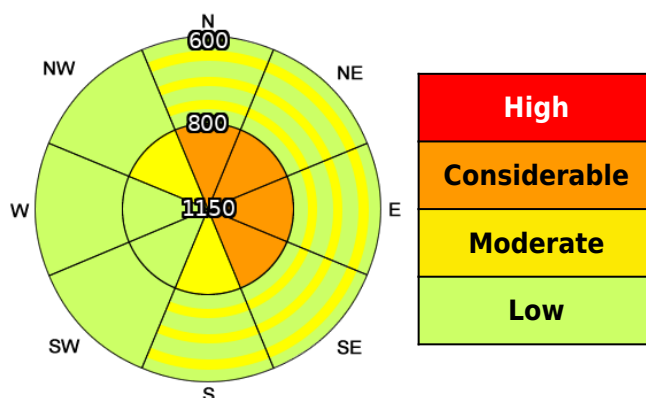


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE CONSIDERABLE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Tuesday 13/02/2018****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Persistent Weak Layers****Cornices****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Additional accumulations of poor to weakly bonded windslab will develop in many wind sheltered locations. North through East to South-East aspects above 800 metres will be particularly affected and here avalanches are likely. Unstable windslab will also be present on North-West and South aspects and steep lee locations at lower levels. Unstable cornices will also start to develop. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

After a dry night there will be heavy snow showers above 450 metres during the morning, becoming lighter in the afternoon. South-South-Easterly gale force winds overnight, easing to fresh for a time, then becoming strong whilst veering to the West-North-West by mid-afternoon.
