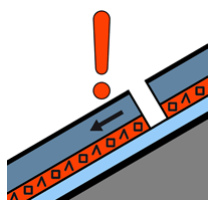

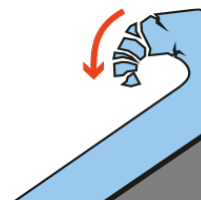

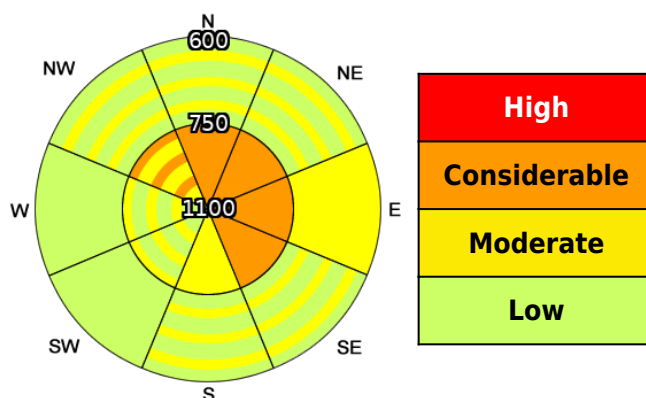

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Stability will decline progressively from late morning onwards as the freezing level rises. Most affected locations will be steep North-West through North to South-East aspects above 750m with sluffing and wet snow instability becoming prevalent later. Avalanches likely. All recently formed cornices will weaken and be prone to sudden collapse. Better stability on ridges and all areas exposed to recent wind scouring. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable



Forecast Weather Influences

Early evening snow showers easing to light and occasional during the day. Moderate South-West winds easing to light and becoming Southerly or South-Easterly. Cold overnight but the freezing level rising quickly from mid morning and becoming 1600m by the end of the day.

Comments

Freezing level 600m overnight until approx 9am then up to 1600m by 5pm.
