Forecast Weather Influences

The snow pack will remain frozen with generally good stability on all aspects. Sun exposed aspects will soften slightly later in the day and some sloughing can be expected. The avalanche hazard will be Low.

Observed Weather Influences

Frosty this morning followed by a clear dry day with moderate South-East winds.

Observed Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

The snow pack is firm and stable on all aspects with some surface instabilities and softening on sun exposed slopes. The avalanche hazard is Low.
