





**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

The older snow pack will remain firm and stable. Isolated patches of poorly bonded wind slab could begin to build on leeward slopes above 700 metres mainly on South to West aspects. These patches of newly formed wind slab should not be deep or extensive but will be poorly bonded. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



**Forecast Weather Influences**

Cold and light East winds will increase in strength overnight becoming fresh East-North-East. It will be mainly dry with only a small amounts of snow forecast for a couple of hours during the early morning. The freezing level will lower from 400 metres to around 200 metres by the end of the period.

**Comments**

Its been very cld but bright day. A hard snow surface on all aspects and altitudes.
