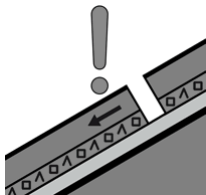
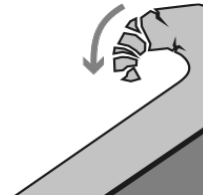
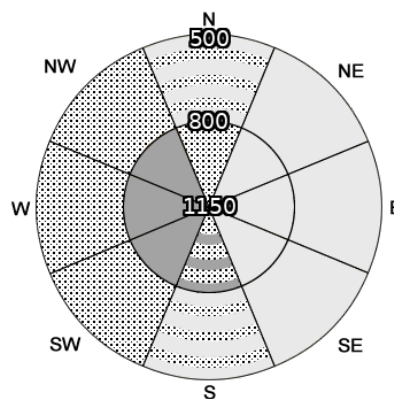

Unstable windslab will continue to form on South through West to North aspects. Avalanches are likely above 800 metres on South-West to North-West aspects especially in wind sheltered locations. Fragile cornices will continue to develop. Moderately bonded deposits will be encountered below 800 metres on the above mentioned aspects. Windward slopes and exposed locations will be scoured and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Snowfall has been forecast throughout the next period. Winds will be strong East-North-Easterly overnight veering Easterly around 9am. It will remain exceptionally cold, freezing at all levels.

Comments

Serious mountain weather encountered: Exceptionally cold air temperature and significant wind chill. Eye protection essential in constant heavy drifting. Thigh deep drifts in sheltered locations.
