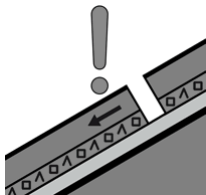
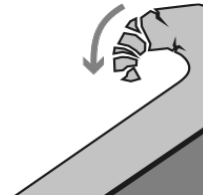
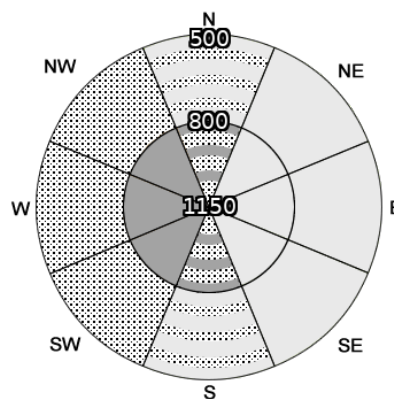


THE AVALANCHE HAZARD WILL BE CONSIDERABLE**Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Saturday 03/03/2018****Avalanche Problems****Wind Slab****Persistent Weak Layers****Cornices****Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Snowfall and drifting of deposits will continue to form unstable windslab on South-West to North-West aspects above 800 metres and, to a lesser extent, on South and North aspects. Avalanches are likely in steeper, wind sheltered locations. Fragile cornices will continue to develop. Extensive areas of moderately well bonded snow will be present on the same aspects below 800 metres. Easterly aspects and exposed locations will be scoured and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.

**Forecast Weather Influences**

Light snowfall throughout the forecast period. Strong Easterly winds decreasing slightly during the day. Freezing level rising to 250 metres.

Mountain access difficult at present. Roads remain closed. Tracks and paths drifted in.
