



Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The old snowpack will remain firm and stable throughout. Localised accumulations of moderately bonded windslab will persist and continue to build in wind sheltered aspects. Most affected are steep slopes, South-West to North-West aspects above 600 metres, notably gullies, scarp slopes and coire rims. Cornices will continue to build above these aspects.. Minor cross loading on selected sheltered North and South aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Winds remaining Easterly and slightly increasing in strength becoming strong by early morning accompanied by showers from early morning onwards. These falling as snow above 300 metres as the freezing level remains fairly constant at around 400 metres.

Comments

Extensive areas of hard snow ice above 500 metres. 600 metres cloud base most of the day.
