

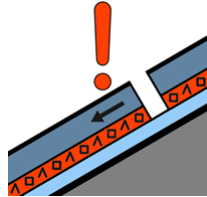

**Wind Slab**



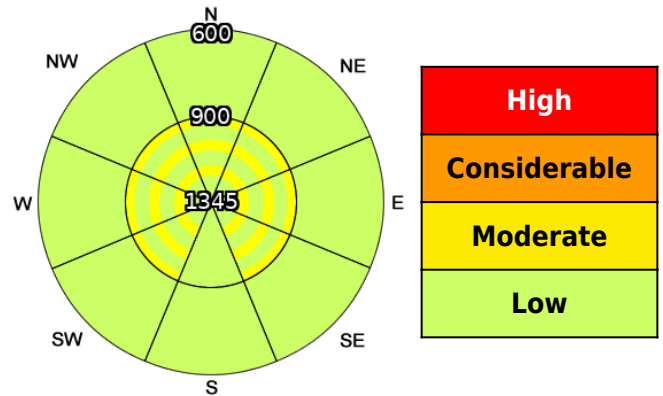

**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Fresh unstable windslab will be deposited in wind sheltered areas. Greatest accumulations will be on North to East aspects above 900 metres where avalanches are likely. Weaknesses will also persist in recently deposited windslab, especially on West and North-West aspects above 900 metres. Freshly formed cornices will be prone to collapse. Wind scoured slopes with exposed snow-ice will be frozen and generally stable. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



**Forecast Weather Influences**

Snow showers are expected above about 400 metres throughout the forecast period. Winds will be strong South-South-Westerly or South-Westerly. The freezing level will be around 600 metres.

**Comments**

Redistribution of recently deposited snow will take place through the forecast period.
