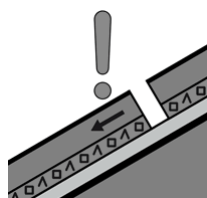

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Tuesday 13/03/2018

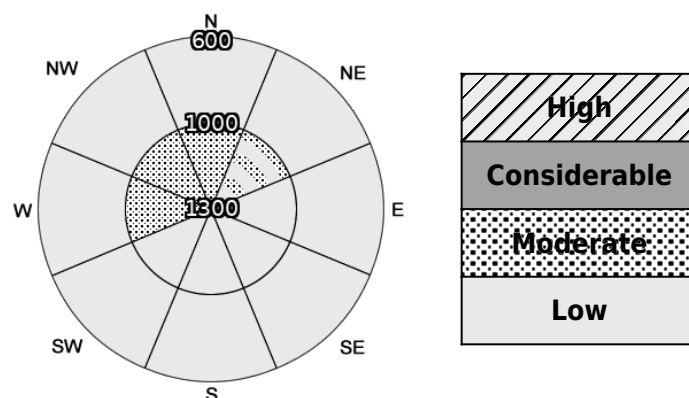
Avalanche Problems



Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will remain firm in the cooler temperatures and will be generally well bonded and stable in most areas. However widespread instabilities will persist at depth on Westerly to Northerly aspects above 1000 metres, but most affected places will be very steep; shaded slopes, around coire rims, convex shaped terrain, gully exits, and where windslab is shallowest. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

A dry day is expected with a freezing level around 800 metres. Winds light to moderate strength, variable West to Southerly.

Comments

In most place the firm and deeper snowpack bridges the weakness. In steep places where the snowpack is shallower can the weak layer be most affected, especially with high additional loads. (one or more persons)
